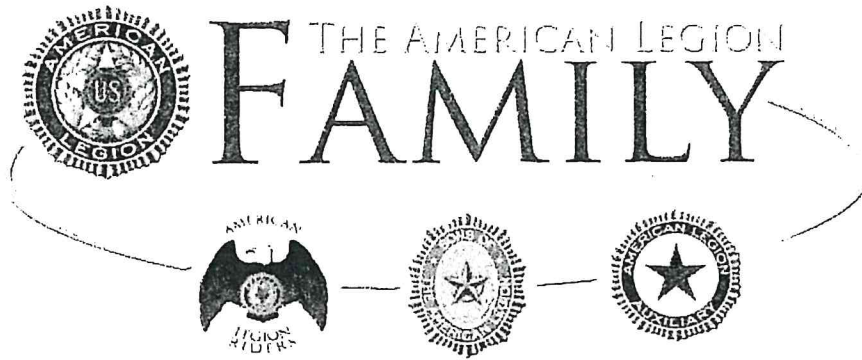

## HISTORIAN

This year, as your Department Historian, I am taking the opportunity to explore the history of the American Legion Auxiliary, not only our Department of Michigan history, but also our ALA National history. The ALA history volumes (8 of them) are filled with interesting facts and stories starting in 1921 and running to the year 2000. Plans are under way now at the national level to continue our written history and make this information available not only to members of our Legion Family but also to anyone interested in learning more about the American Legion Auxiliary – about Who We Are – What We Do – and Why We Matter.

Here are some of the interesting pieces of our National History pertinent to the Department of Michigan:

- ❖ The first National Convention was called to order on November 1, 1921 in the Grand Avenue Temple in Kansas City, Missouri. American Legion Commander John G. Emery opened the convention and after he made a few brief remarks, the convention body elected Dr. Helen Hughes Hielscher from the Department of Minnesota as the Temporary Chairman of the Convention. Dr. Hielscher, although from the Department of Minnesota, had received her medical degree years earlier from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.
- ❖ The Department of Michigan, having already completed all the necessary requirements to acquire the status as a department, was allowed 12 delegates with voice and vote at the first National Convention.
- ❖ There were 42 departments organized by the time of the first convention, including the Canal Zone, which is no longer a department. These 42 departments had anywhere from 5 to 18 delegates with voice and vote – the number of delegates being based on membership totals.
- ❖ The following departments were not fully organized enough to have full delegate status with voice and vote – they were allowed 5 representatives with voice, but no vote: Alaska, Alabama, Arkansas, Maryland, Utah, West Virginia and Wyoming.
- ❖ The following Michigan members were appointed to the national committees:
  - Finance – Anna M. Cross – the first Department Secretary
  - Resolutions – Ada C. Stangster – Department President 1921-1922
  - Credentials – Mrs. Franc C. Adams
  - Permanent Organization – Katherine S. Laughton – Department President 1928-1929
  - Unit Organization and Activities - Margaret Taft
  - Constitution – Bertha Taft
  - Rules – Nora Conlin
  - Legislation – Julia A. Monroe
  - Welfare and Hospital Relief – Mrs. George Olsen

The following is taken directly from the National American Legion Auxiliary, Volume 1:

*The Department of Michigan was organized during a caucus held in Grand Rapids, January 25<sup>th</sup>, 1921. Immediately following the caucus an executive meeting was held and tentative plans for organization and work were made and officers elected.*

*President.....Mrs. Ada G. Sangster, Cheboygan  
Vice President.....Miss Florence N. Smith, Lansing  
Secretary.....Miss Anna M. Cross, Jackson  
Treasurer.....Mrs. Julia Monroe, Grand Rapids*

*Miss Anna M. Cross donated her services as Secretary and the many necessary expenses connected with that office in memory of her brother, Ralph E. Cross, who was killed in France.*

Look for more Michigan history to be told in Unit Mailings throughout this year. Also, as Historian, I am undertaking a project called "Michigan Faces". After seeing what the Department of New York did to find missing pictures of the many Fallen Heroes whose names appear on the Vietnam Wall in Washington, D.C., I asked permission from President Deanna to do this in Michigan also. There are 173 Michigan Fallen Heroes who are missing pictures on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund website. Next month, I will present in the Unit Mailing how units across Michigan can help with this project.

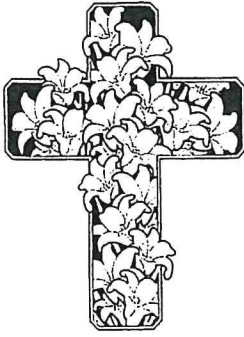
