OUR RELATIONSHIP TO THE AMERICAN LEGION

The ALA was founded in 1919 to support The American Legion, the largest organization of U.S. wartime veterans. Our mutual purpose is to make life better for our veterans, military, and their families. We work steadfastly, side by side, promoting patriotism and national security while supporting youth and advocating for those who have served our country.

ALA UNITS

The American Legion Auxiliary unit is where grassroots work of the Auxiliary takes place. There are more than 8,000 ALA units nationwide. At the local level,

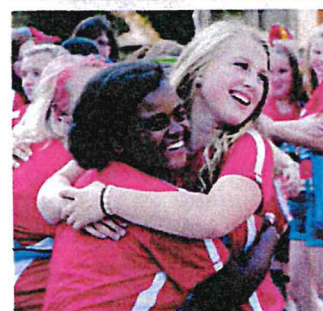


The American Legion is called a post, and the Auxiliary is called a unit. All ALA units are attached to a Legion post, taking its name, location, and number (e.g., John P. Hand American Legion Auxiliary Unit 250), but units are not obligated to meet at the Legion post. If the post is no longer active, a unit may continue to function as what's called a widow unit. Sons of The American Legion groups within Legion posts at the community level are referred to as squadrons.

A note about ALA membership dues

An American Legion Auxiliary member's dues are made up of three portions, representing the three levels of our organization — national, department (state), and unit. The dues amount listed on your renewal notice is a total of these three portions. Membership dues are paid annually and can be paid directly to your unit, by calling ALA National Headquarters at (317) 569-4500, or by logging in to your profile on the national website at www.ALAforVeterans.org and paying your dues online.

The Auxiliary membership year is January 1 to December 31. Members pay dues prior to the start of the upcoming membership year, and many units start collecting dues six months in advance.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is The American Legion "Family"?

The American Legion Family is comprised of The American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, and Sons of The American Legion. The Legion Family also includes American Legion Riders, a program of American Legion Family members for motorcycle enthusiasts. While members of The American Legion Family are individually unique, collectively we are a multi-million member powerhouse of caring advocates dedicated to service.

What are the advantages of American Legion Auxiliary membership?

The ALA is a remarkable organization with nearly 100 years of service to

veterans and the nation's communities. In addition to the personal gratification and rewards gained in voluntary service, there are many tangible benefits for members of the ALA. Members receive a complimentary subscription to the Auxiliary's national quarterly magazine and have exclusive access to a wide variety of discount services and supplemental insurance products. Members can also receive discounts for things such as vehicles, eyeglasses, prescriptions, rental cars, restaurants, department stores, and popular entertainment venue tickets. The Auxiliary Emergency Fund is a national grant assistance program that provides temporary emergency help to eligible members of the American Legion Auxiliary who have suffered a significant financial setback as the result of an act of nature or other personal crisis.

What if I need to update my name and/or address? Can I do this online?

Members whose dues are current can create an account to log in to the Members Only area on the national website to update their name, mailing address, phone number, and email address at any time. If log-in assistance is needed, email ALAMIShelp@ALAforVeterans.org.

I paid my ALA dues. Why haven't I received my membership card?

Units are to provide members their card upon payment of dues. A member who has paid her dues but has not received her membership card needs to contact her unit or department headquarters. The National Organization ships pre-printed membership cards for the upcoming membership year to each department prior to their annual department convention dates (usually between May and July) so that departments can distribute the cards to their units at that time.

How do I find my member ID number?

New senior members receive a 'Thank you for joining' postcard after they join. Their member ID number is located on the address label of this postcard. A member's ID number is also listed on the address label of their quarterly *Auxiliary* magazine. Members can email membership@ALAforVeterans.org to request their ID number. Members will need their ID number in order to create their online profile on the national website.

ATTENTION MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMEN

Due to membership errors that continue to be a problem, please take note of the following:

If you have access to the National Membership System, ALAMIS, you should check often to be sure that all of your members have been marked paid.

You can do this by going into the Unit Report section and printing a paid member report. This can be compared to the transmittals you have sent to the Department office. If someone is missing, please do not hesitate to contact the office to get it corrected. It is imperative that your membership is correct. Members will lose their continuous years if there is a year missing.

If you do not have access to ALAMIS, and your number of paid members does not match the Membership Report posted weekly, you can request a report from the Department office.

Keep in mind that the membership report can be off by one or two based on any transfers you might have. Numbers pulled from the National system are based on members paid to your unit. Thus, if a member transferred in after paying their dues to their previous unit, they will not reflect on your current membership.

Please help us maintain an accurate compilation of our membership.

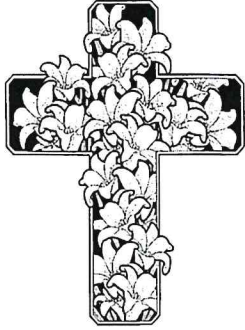

Legislative: for all to read and act. Please pass this on to all members. We must all contact our Senators in Washington D.C. so they may hear our voice regarding these matters.

VA announces alternative treatments for PTSD, TBI.

On Dec. 7, VA announced the availability of two alternative treatments for post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and traumatic brain injuries (TBI). Veterans with a mild to moderate TBI may now access light emitting diode therapy.

On Dec. 6, VA announced a partnership with the Humane Society to encourage veterans to adopt and work with rescued animals. Animal therapy has also been shown to alleviate a wide variety of mental health problems.

On Dec. 12, VA announced that it has teamed up with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to create the Mayor's Challenge to prevent suicide among servicemembers, veterans and their families.

The House of Representatives approved several bills that affect veterans. These measures now move to the Senate for consideration. A few of the bills include:

H.R. 918: Veteran Urgent Access to Mental Healthcare Act – This bill would require VA to provide an initial mental health assessment and any subsequent mental health services required to meet urgent mental health care needs to former servicemembers who would otherwise be ineligible for such services because they were discharged from military service under other than honorable conditions.

H.R. 1066: VA Management Alignment Act of 2017 – This bill would require VA to submit a report regarding the roles, responsibility and accountability of elements and individuals of VA.

H.R. 1133: Veterans Transplant Coverage Act – This bill would authorize VA to provide all care and services needed for a veteran to receive an organ transplant from a live donor, regardless of whether the donor is eligible for VA health care or whether the health care facility is part of VA.

H.R. 3122: Veterans Care Financial Protection Act of 2017 – This bill would direct VA to work with federal agencies and states to develop and implement standards that protect individuals who are eligible for this increased pension from dishonest, predatory or otherwise unlawful practices.

H.R. 3562: Amend title 38, United States Code, to authorize the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to furnish assistance for adaptations of residences of veterans in rehabilitation programs – The bill would give VA-designated appraisers the ability to rely solely on information from approved third parties, such as a desktop appraisal, when determining a home's value for a VA home loan.

H.R. 3705: Veterans Fair Debt Notice Act – This bill would instruct VA to use plain language in its debt notices to provide a clear explanation of why VA is alleging that the veteran owes such a debt.

H.R. 4173: Veterans Crisis Line Study Act of 2017 – This bill would require VA to conduct a study on the outcomes and efficacy of the Veterans Crisis Line based on an analysis of national suicide data and data collected from the VCL.

Legislation recently signed by President Trump

P.L. 115-75' The Veterans Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2017. This bill directs VA to increase – as of Dec. 1, 2017 – the rates of veterans' wartime disability compensation, additional compensation for dependents, the clothing allowance for certain disabled veterans, and dependency and indemnity compensation for surviving spouses and children.

P.L. 115-86: The VA Prescription Drug Accountability Act of 2017. This legislation compels VA to share all controlled substance prescribing information with state-run databases.

The Shutdown Happened: How Does It Affect Our Servicemembers

We've been here a few times over the past few years, so we have some idea what families should expect – although there are plenty of unknowns.

How will our military families be impacted? Here's what we know:

Will our service member get paid?

No. BUT if Congress is able to pass a separate bill to continue military pay, service members should receive compensation as usual. They did this in 2013 with the Pay Our Military Act.

If Congress doesn't pass a separate bill, there are several banking institutions, such as USAA, Navy Federal Credit Union, and Marine Federal Credit Union, who have been known to advance military pay to their customers during government shutdowns. Suggest to your military family and friends to contact their bank to inquire about their policies for situations like these.

If funds are tight and their financial institution doesn't provide advance pay in the event of a government shutdown, here are a few things our military servicemembers can do:

- Ask their bank if they would be willing to waive late or overdraft fees;
- Contact their creditors and let them know about your situation;
- Call their Service relief society for financial help:
 - Air Force Aid Society (AFAS)
 - Army Emergency Relief (AER)
 - Coast Guard Mutual Assistance (CGMA)
 - Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society (NMCRS)
- If you don't have an aid society, contact the Red Cross, or call 866-563-1376.

Following past shutdowns, Congress has voted to restore pay to federal employees whose compensation was temporarily stopped.

Do our service members still have to show up for work?

Yes. All military personnel are considered essential, and must report for duty during a shutdown regardless of pay.

Will the base schools, Exchange, Commissary, Child Development Center, (etc.) be closed?

Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) schools remained open during the last two government shutdowns, as did military Exchanges. Child Development Centers (CDC) also stayed open on a case-by-case basis. Check with your installation CDC to learn more.

Commissaries located in the United States closed during the 2013 government shutdown, while OCONUS commissaries remained open.

For the newly bereaved:

With a government shutdown, there is no way for the government to pay the death gratuity (\$100,000) benefit. This benefit is typically used to cover family expenses after a service member dies and funds funeral-related costs not covered by the government. The death gratuity is often viewed as "bridge money" to ensure the family has funds available before ongoing survivor benefits are put in place. During the 2013 government shutdown, the Fisher House helped bridge this gap as a contractor and provided benefits to families of the fallen.

Service members Group Life Insurance (SGLI), typically a \$400,000 benefit, will be paid to a new beneficiary. This typically takes about a week following a death.

Government-funded travel for surviving family members to attend the dignified transfer ceremony at Dover Air Force Base, unit memorials, or funerals may not be paid during the shutdown.

Funeral benefits that are typically provided by the government for active-duty deaths may not be paid either.

The Social Security Administration may not be able to process claims for new benefits, so the newly-bereaved would have to wait until after a government shutdown ends, potentially, for a new social security claim for benefits to be processed

Families choosing to inter their loved ones at national cemeteries managed by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) may have to wait longer for burial or internment.

Arlington National Cemetery should continue to follow its set funeral schedule (which is often planned months in advance).

FINDING MICHIGAN FACES



In celebration of the 35th Anniversary of the Vietnam Wall, the Department of Michigan is joining the Department of New York in searching for missing photos of our Fallen Heroes whose names appear on the Vietnam Memorial Wall. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund has placed the names of Fallen Heroes inscribed on the Vietnam Memorial Wall on their website: www.vvmf.org/thewall. Along with each name, is information regarding that Fallen Hero: full name, date of birth, date of death, place of death, branch of service and home town. When available, there is also a picture of that Fallen Hero. Sadly, many of these Fallen Heroes do not have pictures on the website. There are 166 Michigan names with no pictures.

As a History Project, the Department of Michigan is attempting to find as many pictures as possible of our Fallen Heroes. Most of the pictures used are military pictures, but that is not a requirement. Some pictures are from high school yearbooks; others are family pictures. To get this project going, I have extracted and documented the names of those Michigan Fallen Heroes who need to have pictures added to the Virtual Wall. To make it easier, I have listed the names in alphabetical order of their home towns. I am hoping that you will take the time to look over the names on this list and see if you recognize any of the names. If so and you have a way to obtain a picture to submit, that would be great. Directions for how to submit are on the above website. Perhaps you are a history buff and see the name(s) of someone from your home town or current place of residence and would like to do some research, that too would be great. Perhaps as an Americanism or Community Service project, you would like to do some research

to locate pictures of these names, that would be awesome. Anything that you do would be appreciated – and don't forget to record your efforts in your Unit Reporting for the year. In the month that I have been working to prepare this project for presentation to you, there have been six pictures of Michigan Fallen Heroes added to the Virtual Wall. I hope that you will join me in this effort, as we work to better document the history of our Michigan men and women who gave their lives for our freedom.

If you find and submit a picture to the website, please send me an email so that I can keep track of how many pictures have been located by Michigan ALA members.

I will be talking more about this at Winter Meeting, along with other pieces of Michigan ALA history. I am hoping to see you there.
