We cannot stress how informative this conference is, especially for newer members who are stepping up to be on committees, etc.


Yes, we know it costs money to attend. If you want your Unit to be active and successful, you need to spend some money. Remember 4 people can room together!





A CELEBRATION OF MEMORIES ROAD SHOW

MEMORIAL DAY WEEK, 2019

For 2 years, the American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) has given its enthusiastic support to the development of the documentary film, *Letters Home*, the amazing true story of tracking down the identity of the WWII soldier was whose letters and memorabilia were discovered in a box of items bought at an auction a thousand miles away, then tracking the veteran down, and then the emotional returning of the items to him. You'll laugh and you'll cry at this poignant documentary.

Last August, Naptown Media shared the world premiere of the film with a standing-room only crowd of more than 250 ALA leaders. Next Memorial Day, 2019, the ALA will again share in the film's broadcast premier on several PBS stations across the country, and in a very special way.

We're calling it "A Celebration of Memories Road Show" – a special event your Unit can host in association with the PBS premier of *Letters Home*. Your ALA unit will have a chance to:

- 1) Be recognized on your participating local PBS station;
- 2) Host an event for the community to help civilians honor their family heroes;
- 3) Have a private screening of the film;
- 4) Record the stories of your post home WWII vets along with your own stories of your family heroes.

During your "A Celebration of Memories" event, here's what the evening schedule will look like:

- 1) 6:00: Doors open to the public
- 2) 6:00 7:15: Memories Road Show: You'll have some of your older, more knowledgeable Legionnaires and ALA members available to talk with Unit and Post members and the general public who bring in family memorabilia from WWII or other wars. Similar to PBS' "Antiques Road Show," your experts will help families understand the meaning of the war-era souvenirs so they will appreciate more their loved one's service to our Country.
- 3) 6:00 7:15: Open Video Booth: You'll set up an iPhone tripod and a good light, and film personal stories. Start with any WWII or Korean War Veterans from your Post home, then invite other Unit/Post members to tell stories about their service, their family's sacrifice, or a loved one. And through the evening, be sure to gather stories about veterans from the community members who are visiting.
- 4) 6:00 7:15: Donate Memorabilia Booth: some members of the public may have come into possession of a soldier's souvenirs. They don't know what to do with them but want someone who will honor them to take care of them. Give people this opportunity, along with a chance to talk about these memories. Then, you can store/display them at your post or pass them along to the *Letters Home* folks.







- 5) 7:15: Ask people to begin to head to the screening area. Offer popcorn and drinks and settle in for a screening of the moving film *Letters Home*.
- 6) 7:30 7:55: Letters Home Screening: You'll have access to the film so that you can view it in your post home with your friends and neighbors, AND have the chance to watch it that week on your participating PBS station.
- 7) 7:55 8:15: Testimonials: Ask your emcee to invite people to share stories about their memorabilia, their loved ones' memorabilia, or other things that cause them to want to express honor for their veteran's service.
- 8) 8:15: Event officially ends. Encourage people to go to the Video Booth to leave a story, go to the Roadshow table to get advice, and give the community members the warmest possible gratitude as you say goodbye at the close of the event.

After the event, you, along with thousands of others across the country, will be able to upload the stories you filmed onto a special *Letters Home* website that will archive them for posterity.

Timeline:

A preliminary timeline for the "A Celebration of Memories Road Show" event is as follows:

- May, 2018: "A Celebration of Memories Road Show" is introduced at the ALA Department Leadership National Conference in Indianapolis
- August, 2018: Official Kickoff of "A Celebration of Memories Road Show" at the Legion and ALA National Conventions in Minneapolis
- September December, 2018: Units discuss with membership and decide to participate
- January: Online organizational training session for participating units. Your Unit will receive
 everything you need to organize and promote the event for the best success.
- February Milestone: Committee in place with assignments made and training done (training videos will be provided). Participating local PBS stations meet with Unit's event team in their broadcast area
- March Milestone: First Committee member reports made. At this point, any problems can be identified with support given. PBS promotional schedule announced.
- April Milestone: Promotion begins after the Easter/Passover holidays
- May Milestone: Final arrangements confirmed; promotion in full swing; key community leaders committed; media projector and sound system lined up and tested for the screening.
- June: Celebration!!! Evaluate the experience, upload the videos from your Video Story Booth, ship any donated materials as needed.

This is an exciting opportunity for ALA unit members to invite our community's families into our Legion Post home and help them celebrate the memories and service of their loved ones, along with recognizing our own Legion Family heroes. How memorable – thank you for participating!



IMPACT ALA! ALA CENTENNIAL STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

ALA ACADEMY LAUNCHES FOURTH LEARNING COURSE



The American Legion Auxiliary Academy launched in May 2017 and has added a handful of courses in its first year.

A fourth online course is now available: ALA Culture Basics: Establishing a Culture of Goodwill. This thought-provoking course was designed to help ALA members better understand how our attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors impact ALA membership and the ALA's ability to serve our mission, said Stephanie Abisi, special projects and operations administrator at National Headquarters.

This course is part of the Culture Basics module and will take about 40 minutes to complete.

The ALA Academy is a free, professionally developed online training program developed as an initiative from the ALA Centennial Strategic Plan to help us achieve our five goals, Abisi added.

Based on feedback from the ALA Organizational Effectiveness Assessment conducted in 2015, the ALA Academy strives to address the needs and concerns brought to light through the assessment. A top finding from the assessment showed that creating a culture of goodwill is the overarching issue that will have the most impact on the ability for the American Legion Auxiliary to thrive in the long-term.

The ALA Academy, which allows for self-paced learning, peer sharing, peer mentoring, and opportunities for ongoing training, began with two courses — ALA 101 and ALA Communication Methods. A third course was added last fall — ALA Leadership: Living Our

Motto of Service Not Self.

Over 1,000 members have completed ALA 101, about 900 have finished ALA Communication Methods, and so far, over 250 members have completed ALA Leadership, Abisi said.

The ALA Academy is designed for both new and seasoned ALA members. For new members, it will give participants a chance to learn even more about the organization at their own pace; for seasoned members, the courses are a good refresher.

How can departments utilize the ALA Academy for training?

New members are encouraged to check out the ALA National Headquarters website and the ALA Academy, especially ALA 101, as it is a course designed for all ALA members.

For those applying for certain leadership positions, departments could begin asking those individuals to complete ALA Academy courses. National Headquarters will work with departments to provide information on who has taken the courses.

To get started on your first ALA Academy course or to take another, visit www.ALAforVeterans.org/ALA-Academy.

In-depth, detailed descriptions of current and future courses are available on the website as well.

COURSES AVAILABLE

ALA 101: the introductory course to the ALA Academy, focusing on who we are, what we do, and why we matter.

ALA Communication Methods: an introduction to how the ALA uses e-communication, basic how-to information for using social media.

ALA Leadership: Living Our Motto of Service Not Self. reviews what it means to be a leader and that leadership is not only a title — it is helping others to stay mission-focused and leading by our guiding principles.

Establishing a Culture of Goodwill: designed to help ALA members better understand how our attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors impact ALA membership and the ALA's ability to serve our mission.

FUTURE COURSES

Marketing Leadership: This course will help members with their efforts to recruit new members, and identify the ALA brand.

Handling Conflict: This course will identify different conflict reaction styles and how to manage them.

Diversity: ALA members will gain a better understanding of what diversity is and learn the techniques for embracing diversity in their outreach and day-to-day activities.

Managing Change: This course is designed to help master techniques for managing change, creating a change management plan, and helping others embrace change.

Effective Communication: This course will help ALA members understand how to be effective communicators in modern times.
